

ORGANIC TEA CROWERS

PUTHAR.JHORA TEA GARDEN

Purharjhora tea garden is nestled in rhe Dooars region of India, where rhe flar G:mgeric plains of West Bengal meet rhe foothills of rhe mighry 1-limabyas. n1e garden is Oanked on either side by rhe swifi Oowing mountain stre:Ims of rhe Rinchingron river on one side and rhe Chel river on rhe other side. The rocky river beds of rhese rwo famous rivers gave rhe rea garden its name 'Pmhar' meaning rock and 'Jhora' meaning stre:Im or river.

Sirnared ar m elevation of 350 meters, Purh:Irjhora has been certified Organic and Biodynamic since 1997. Ir is rhe only certified organic rel garden in rhe entire Dooars region. Covering an expanse of 566 hecrares, rhe rea is grown under a three tiered canopy of shade rrees and leguminous plants. As practitioners of Bio-dynamic and Organic tel forming, we do nor use pesticides and only depend on narmal predator insects to combat pests. Between every row of rea bushes in the tea garden, there are microhabirats that are filled with a great diversity of low growing green plants, legumes, worms and beneficial insects such as bmrerOies and spiders. Tea is grown by using organic and biodynamic preparations and harnessing the cosmic forces of nature. These agricultural practices have resulted in an abundance of wildlife such as Elephants, Pyrhons, Porcupines and Deers. Pmh:Irjhora also has close to 350 species of trees, which make it a birders paradise. Walking through the tea garden you will very easily be able to spot Pheasanrs, Minivets, Woodpeckers, Owls, Hornbills, Rollers and Peacocks.

The rich organic soil and narnral spring waters provide perfect conditions for the tea bushes to blossom and give them their unique characteristics. Grown from the Assam and young clonal variety of Camellia Sinensis tea plant which include CP-1 variety rhat is unique to Putharjhora. Putharjhora produces close to 400,000 kilograms of brisk, strong and smooth black and green orrhodox teas.

Purharjhora is also known to have a huge migratory Elephant popubrion of close ro 100 Elephants. The elephant herds traverse the rea garden from the Bhuran hills and move towards the forests in Nepal. The tea garden has recently parrnered with 'Ille Wildlife Enterprise' an independent organisation which strives to protect Elephanr populations globally. Together with Tel Promoters India. WFEN has bunched a Hum:111-Elephant conOicr m:Inagemenr campaign in Purharjhora. In 20:w, rhe rea garden was awarded the cerrific1tion for the first 'Elephant friendly Tea Garden' in rhe Dooars region.

nle tel garden supports 1000 tea workers and their fillililies by providing housing, sanitation, medical, creche and education filcilities is p.lir of their fairrrade initiatives.
